Placement Agreement

The North Central Newfoundland Club Inc. is a non-profit organization recognized by the American Kennel Club to do all in its power to protect and advance the interests of Newfoundland dogs.

A Newfoundland should not be acquired casually or disposed of lightly but sometimes an owner's circumstances change and the Newf is unsuited to his/her present home. It is on these rare occasions that we try to find a permanent new home where the Newfoundland will be loved and respected for its unique combination of qualities. Please review the following conditions which the NCNC Newf Rescue Network has developed for placement homes:

- 1. Your home should provide a safe environment, which complies with local ordinances and adequate shelter from the cold and hot weather. A Newf must never be allowed to run loose and should always carry ID tags, tattoo or microchip.
- 2. The Newfoundland must be spayed or neutered upon placement and may not be used for breeding purposes. AKC papers, if available, will be supplied upon proof of neutering.
- 3. Even if the Newf is trained, a refresher Obedience course is urged to establish more rapidly respect and rapport between you and your dog.
- 4. If you can no longer keep this dog, please advise the Newfoundland Rescue Network of your dog's availability.
- 5. The adoption fee charged by the NCNC Newf Rescue Network is \$200.00. The fee is charged to help defray the expenses incurred for transportation, boarding, grooming, etc. of Newfs in need.
- 6. It is agreed and understood that the North Central Newfoundland Club, Inc. and others working for and/or associated with the Club shall not be responsible for any damage or injury caused by a Newfoundland placed through the NCNC Rescue Network. This includes, but is not limited to, dog bites to persons or animals, or property damage.

The Undersigned has read, understands and agrees to the conditions set forth and hereby further agrees that if the terms and conditions of this Agreement are not upheld by the undersigned and/or if any misrepresentations have been made to the NCNC Rescue Network, the Network reserves the right to terminate this Agreement and the dog must be returned to the NCNC Rescue Network. Should it become necessary for the NCNC Rescue Network to take legal action to recover the Newfoundland or otherwise enforce the provisions of this Agreement, the Undersigned agrees to pay all court costs and reasonable attorney's fees.
